



What to Expect with Your Roofing Project

Here are a few tips to help you prepare for your roofing project:

Noise Level: Without a doubt, the roofing process can be noisy. If you have pets that are sensitive to loud noises, you may want to consider finding them a temporary place to stay during your project. As a reminder, you do not have to be home while the work is being done.

Electricity: Please make electricity available for the crew. An exterior outlet or an outlet in your garage would be sufficient.

Starting Time: This is generally between 7:00 - 8:30 a.m. Monday - Friday and some Saturdays. Start and end times may vary.

Protection: The attic might collect debris during your roofing replacement. If you have items in your attic you may want to protect them. You will also want to cover any precious items you have in the garage with a tarp to protect from debris. This might include a car, motorcycle, tools, etc.

Remove Décor: The vibrations from hammering can sometimes knock decorations off of the walls, so you should take them down ahead of time. This might include mirrors, pictures, wreaths, loose shelving, etc.

Deliveries: A dumpster and the materials will be delivered to your home several days before the installation starts. Your project manager will keep you informed of the timing of the deliveries. You do not have to be home for these deliveries.

Construction Site: Be Aware - Once work begins, even with the best of care the property becomes a construction site. Homeowners, family members, and visitors should exercise caution when entering the construction area. Be sure to take steps to keep pets and children out of harm's way.

What to Expect with Your Windows Project

Preparing for Installation: Please remove any valuables, pictures and knick-knacks from the window installation area.

If you prefer to install them yourself our window installers can help you understand what the city requires.
